Laura Cabrera

Dr. Cabrera is Assistant Professor of Neuroethics at the Center for Ethics and Humanities in the Life Sciences. She is also Faculty Affiliate at the National Core for Neuroethics, University of British Columbia. Laura Cabrera's interests focus on the ethical and societal implications of neurotechnology, in particular when use for enhancement purposes as well as for treatments in psychiatry.

Nicolas Delon

Nicolas Delon is currently a Law and Philosophy Fellow at the University of Chicago Law School He specializes in issues of animal and environmental ethics. with particular interests in moral status, food, captivity, cities, and social psychology.

Duncan Purves

Duncan Purves is an Assistant Professor of Philosophy at the University of Florida. His areas of research include the foundations and moral significance of harm, the ethics of emerging technologies, and bioethical issues having to do with death and dying.

Melinda Hall (Ph.D., Vanderbilt University) Philosophy at Stetson University. She specializes in bioethics, Continental philosophy, and the philosophy of disability.

Fritz Allhoff
